LG Questions for the Week of April 6, 2008

Getting Started

1. Think back to all the Bible stories you have heard both as a child and as an adult. Which is your favorite story, and why? How has it challenged or encouraged you?

Getting Into the Bible

2. Read Hebrews 3:1-6. Why did the people of Israel hold Moses in such high regard? Describe one event from his life that has impressed you. What quality did Moses and Jesus share in common (3:5-6)? Do you agree that Jesus is superior to Moses? If so, how and why?
3. Read Hebrews 3:7-19. What is the worst sin a person can commit (3:12)? Explain. How did the nation of Israel commit this sin, and what blessings did they forfeit as a result? Do you know anybody who has professed faith in Jesus but has since walked away from God? If so, what dangers do they face, and how do you think God wants you to minister to them?
4. Read Hebrews 4:1-13. The rest that God offers us in these verses is not a physical, but a spiritual rest. From what does this rest relieve us, and what do we need to do in order to “enter it”? How does the Word of God keep us from deceiving ourselves into thinking we are genuine believers because we merely know the truth? Describe how the Bible has convicted you of sin and led you to trust in Jesus.

Getting Personal and Practical

5. Israel’s greatest sins were fear and complaining. They feared to enter the Promised Land because of the giants there, and they complained because of the hardships they faced in the wilderness. Which of these sins do you struggle with most, and what steps will you take to overcome it? Ask for advice and prayer from others in your life group who are facing similar issues.
